

Special Events and Traffic Assignments

- The 12th Man March was a public safety success. Widespread community participation, with no incidents or issues.
- The speed limits entering the Town of Eatonville on SR161 and exiting near Smallwood Park have been lowered by the Washington State Department of Transportation.
 - The new speed zone signs have been flagged for high visibility and we are educating the public through contact and warnings. We are not planning to use enforcement for at least 30 days, unless the speed is high enough to warrant the enforcement action (much higher than old speed limit).
- The Public Safety Committee is reviewing three current EPD requests {1-3} and one still in process {4};
 - Should speed reduction measures {speed bumps} be placed adjacent to the Skate Park, Playground and Recycle Center area to physically slow vehicle traffic?
 - Our hope is physical speed reduction measures in this area will create a safer recreational area for our residents. Roadway is used for 4 way stop bypass.
 - Residential speed limits:
 - Current E.M.C. has reduced the speed limit in most of our residential areas to 15mph. State law places the speed limit in all incorporated towns and cities to 25mph, unless posted otherwise.
 - In order to enforce the speed zones at lower than 25mph, there needs to be statutory authority {completed with the E.M.C.} and the lower speed limit signs must be posted to alert the citizens of the change {not completed}.
 - The question to the Public Safety Committee – Does the Council want to keep the speed limits at 15mph {mandatory signage needed}, or reset the statutory speed

limits to 25mph, aligning with state speed limits {E.M.C. needs to be changed, but no signage required}?

- Do we need to update the Semi parking E.M.C.'s to align the Council's intent with the needs of the community, or is current E.M.C. sufficient?
 - Semi parking with truck attached has no parking time restrictions.
 - Semi parking with no truck {trailer only} has a 24 hour limit.
 - Requested review is to consider aligning the semi parking E.M.C. with the R.V. code...restricted to 24 hours anywhere in Town.
 - The need for review is caused by a semi truck and trailer parking on Washington adjacent to the Bakery, with citizen complaints of it causing traffic obstruction and distraction during school drop off and pick up periods {current E.M.C. allows this with tractor attached to trailer}.
- Should properly equipped All Terrain Vehicles be allowed to operate on the public roadways in the Town of Eatonville?
 - Washington has changed the state laws to allow properly equipped ATVs to operate on public roadways outside of incorporated Towns and Cities.
 - Decision Point: Change the E.M.C. to bring our statute into alignment with state law, allowing it...or; not change the E.M.C. or allow our residents to operate their properly equipped ATVs on the Town's roadways?
 - Status: Under legal review.

Performance Plan

- The Performance Plan is a Problem Oriented tool that is used by departments to address quality of life issues within their communities.
 - Emphasis of the Week
 - During February, our collective focus will be crime prevention patrols.
 - Vacation checks can be requested by contacting Gaille or any officer and filling out the request and information form.

- Pierce County 911 Service Contract
 - The contract has continued to work well.
 - For number of calls billed, please refer to the calls for service summary of this report.
- South Sound 911 Dispatch and Report Service Contract
 - We are still fine tuning the new radios, radio dispatch, computers in the cars and report writing system, but it is working well to date and we are now tied into the region, both with radios and reports.

Training

- For 2015, the officers will participate and receive their 60 hours of on-going training with the Pierce County Sheriff's Department Training Unit, who provides regional certified training at no cost to their regional partners.
 - Includes 40 hours of in service training {legal updates, emergency vehicle operation, defensive tactics, active shooter and advanced patrol tactics, first aid to include the AED and other necessary topics}.
 - Includes twenty hours of firearms, tactics and lethal force training {2 ten hour training days, one summer and one winter}
 - This training criteria, topics and amount of hours exceeds the standards set by the industry and meets the professional training best practices.

Management Activities

- The review of the current Policies and Procedures Manual is continuous.
- The 2015 Budget is operational.
- The 2015 Department Training Plan is being finalized.
- The Town Emergency Management Plan is being revisited and updated.

Significant Cases

- Dog running at large case {14-342-0854/14-349-0521/15-022-0734}:
 - Pomeranian dog impounded by EPD on three occasions for running at large and was running at large a total of five times within a 45 day period. The last impound was on 01-22-2015 and owners notified. They chose not to pick up the dog for nine days in our impound {statute authorizes destruction/disposal after three days - post notification}.
 - On 01-30-2015, I directed and authorized the dog to be released to the Humane Society for surrender and hopeful adoption after all effort by Animal Control Specialist Bob Walters went unheeded by the dog owners. The owner initially agreed to this course of action.
 - Owner cited into Eatonville Municipal Court for dog running at large violation. Owner owes the Town of Eatonville \$65 in impound and kennel fees @ nine days.

- I talked to the owner on 02-02-2015 and provided them an opportunity to discuss the matter and answered their questions, leaving them a copy of the E.M.C. chapter 6.
- Drug and Arrest Warrant Arrest on Berggren:
 - PCSD community support team had been searching for a subject with four felony arrest warrants and they found him at this address on January 27th.
 - Subject was arrested for the arrest warrants and new drug possession charges. His vehicle was towed, pending application for a search warrant.
 - This is a proactive unit used to resolve community issues within Pierce County through the application of focused resources and community partners. This team is available to support EPD as needed under our PCSD contract.
- Car Theft and recovery on 01-05-2015:
 - The caller reported his vehicle taken from his home on Center Street West at 0229 hours. A PCSD Deputy arrived 7 minutes later and broadcast the vehicle description to regional law enforcement officers and took the theft report under the afterhours contract with PCSD.
 - Deputies positioned themselves along main arterials and the vehicle was seen northbound in the 28800 block of Meridian at 0249 hours. Short pursuit by Deputies and two subjects in custody at 0256 hours (one local to Eatonville and one to Bonney Lake).
 - Deputies behind car 20 minutes after theft reported. Owner notified his undamaged car was recovered within 30 minutes of theft report.
 - This is a testimonial for two actions by the current Town Council members
 - After hours 911 contract with PCSD (previously, an off duty EPD officer would have responded from residence – reporting delay).
 - Contracting police dispatching services to South Sound 911, as we are now tied into the regional law enforcement radio system (previously, dispatched by Fife dispatch, with no local law enforcement on the same radio system).
