I bring to the table a strong experience base as a change agent whether it be as a middle school/high school math teacher; high school varsity football coach; building athletic director; a building administrator, principal; a small business owner, Renate's Gasthaus B and B: 2006 through 2009; secretary/treasurer of Animal Care of Eatonville; volunteer worker at Eatonville's Community Center; or holding position(s) at Christ Episcopal Church in Puyallup.

I used in the previous paragraph the term "change agent." I have learned there should be changes when necessary---not for the sake of change alone, but for a definite improvement of an existing viewpoint protocol, or procedure(s).
