**A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF
EATONVILLE APPROVING AN INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT
BETWEEN PIERCE COUNTY AND ITS CITIES AND TOWNS, WHICH
RATIFIES AND ADOPTS AN AMENDMENT TO THE PIERCE COUNTY
COUNTYWIDE PLANNING POLICIES FOR CONSISTENCY WITH
VISION 2040 AS RECOMMENDED BY THE PIERCE COUNTY
REGIONAL COUNCIL**

WHEREAS, Pierce County Ordinance 2011-34s was passed on July 19th, 2011 by the Pierce County Council to amend the Countywide Planning Policies for consistency with Vision 2040; and

WHEREAS, In order for the amendments to the Countywide Planning Policies to take effect, 60% of Pierce County jurisdictions representing 75% of the total Pierce County population must ratify adoption of the amendments; and

WHEREAS, The Town Council of Eatonville intends to ratify the adoption of the Pierce County Countywide Planning Policy amendments for consistency with Vision 2040, as attached to Pierce County Ordinance 2011-34s as Exhibit B; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Eatonville has determined that the adoption of the County-wide Planning Policy amendments through Interlocal Agreement would be beneficial to the Town by furthering the town's vision, goals and policies found in its comprehensive plan;

NOW, THEREFORE,

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF
EATONVILLE AS FOLLOWS:**

Section 1. The Town Council hereby authorizes the Mayor to execute the Interlocal Agreement, which is attached hereto and also as Exhibit B to Pierce County Ordinance 2011-34s.

SUBJECT: Interlocal Agreement - Amendments to the Pierce County Countywide Planning Policies – VISION 2040 Consistency

The Pierce County Regional Council (PCRC) recommended the attached amendments to the Pierce County Countywide Planning Policies (CPPs). As the first step in the ratification process the Pierce County Council adopted Ordinance No. 2011-34s on July 19, 2011. This action signifies Pierce County's approval of the proposed amendment to provide consistency between VISION 2040 and the PCCs and authorizes the Pierce County Executive to execute interlocal agreements with the Cities and Towns of Pierce County to ratify the proposal. This correspondence is the official transmittal of the PCRC's recommendation to amend the PCCs and request for ratification of the proposal.

The proposal is the incorporation of new and refinement of existing policies through an amendment to the Pierce County Countywide Planning Policies document. The proposal primarily stems from the adoption of VISION 2040, the Puget Sound region's multi-county planning policy document, and its requirement to update the Pierce County Countywide Planning Policies where necessary to ensure consistency between the two planning documents. The extent of the proposed policy change varies by topic. Either edits to existing policy language or new policy language is proposed associated with the following CPP sections: 1) Affordable Housing, 2) Agricultural Lands, 3) Economic Development 4) Education 5) Archaeological and Cultural Preservation, 6) Natural Resources, Open Space, Protection of Environmentally-Sensitive Lands, and the Environment 7) Transportation Facilities and Strategies, 8) Urban Growth Areas, Promotion of Contiguous and Orderly Development and Provision of Urban Services to Such Development, 9) Buildable Lands, and (10) Amendments and Transition. The proposed amendment also introduces three new policy sections to the document: 1) Community and Urban Design, 2) Health and Well-being, and 3) Rural.

The PCRC acknowledged that the proposed '09 Affordable Housing CPP amendment was still outstanding through its action to approve the proposed VISION 2040 Consistency amendment. A few additional jurisdictions were needed to ratify the '09 Housing policies. PCRC noted that if the '09 Housing policies are not ratified prior to forwarding the VISION 2040 amendment package to cities and towns, the '09 Housing policies that had previously been approved by the PCRC shall be incorporated in the VISION 2040 Consistency proposal. Since the PCRC's action, it was thought that the necessary number of jurisdictions had indicated approval to ratify the '09 Housing policies. Accordingly, the policy package approved by Pierce County Council does not identify the '09 Housing policies as proposed, rather the policies are reflected as existing language. Unfortunately, after the County Council's action, it was discovered that the '09 Housing policy package was actually one jurisdiction short for ratification. Subsequently, the

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proposed Housing policies reflect changes recommended in a 2009 effort but have not yet been ratified.

The Pierce County Ordinance which includes the interlocal agreement and amendments to the Countywide Planning Policies and an explanatory sheet are included for your convenience. Please note that jurisdictions do not have the ability to make line item modifications. If your jurisdiction chooses to approve the proposal for ratification it needs to do so through an ordinance or resolution with the interlocal agreement and VISION 2040 Consistency amendment language. It would also be beneficial to notify Pierce County if your jurisdiction chooses to either not take action or take one in opposition to the proposal.

The Pierce County Countywide Planning Policies shall be ratified and become effective when 60 percent of the jurisdictions in Pierce County representing 75 percent of the total population adopt the amendments. This threshold correlates to 14 cities and towns and Pierce County representing a minimum of 601,612 people (based on 2011 OFM estimate).

Please expedite the passage of the interlocal agreement through your respective legislative bodies. After ratification by your jurisdiction, please send **two original signed copies** of the interlocal agreement and a copy of your resolution, ordinance, or meeting minutes authorizing approval to Pierce County Planning and Land Services, Attention: Toni Fairbanks, 2401 S. 35th Street, Room 228, Tacoma, WA 98409. One copy will be returned to your jurisdiction after it has been signed by the Pierce County Executive.

The Pierce County Ordinance which includes the interlocal agreement and amendments to the Countywide Planning Policies and an explanatory sheet are included for your convenience.

WHAT YOU HAVE TO DO:

1. Develop a similar ordinance or resolution in whatever form is used by your jurisdiction. It **is not** necessary for everyone to adopt identical documents.
2. Jurisdictions do not have the ability to make line item modifications; this is a pass or fail policy choice. The ordinance/resolution needs to include two attachments: 1) the interlocal agreement and 2) VISION 2040 Consistency amendments.
3. Have your Council vote on the ordinance/resolution.
4. Have the authorized agents for your jurisdiction sign the interlocal agreement.
5. Submit **two original copies** of your signed resolution/ordinance and interlocal agreement to Toni Fairbanks, Pierce County Planning and Land Services, 2401 S. 35th Street, Room 228, Tacoma, WA 98409.

WHAT HAPPENS NEXT:

Once ordinances/resolutions and interlocal agreements are approved by 60% of the jurisdictions representing 75% of the population in the County, the amendments will become effective. This threshold correlates to 14 cities and towns and Pierce County representing a minimum of 601,612 people (based on 2011 OFM estimate).

22 **Whereas**, the Pierce County Regional Council (PCRC) was created in 1992 by
23 interlocal agreement among the cities and towns of Pierce County and Pierce County
24 Government (the County), and charged with responsibilities, including: serving as a
25 local link to the Puget Sound Regional Council, promoting intergovernmental
26 cooperation, facilitating compliance with the coordination and consistency requirements
27 of the Growth Management Act [GMA] (Chapter 36.70A) and the Regional
28 Transportation Planning Organization (Chapter 47.80 RCW), and developing a
29 consensus among jurisdictions regarding the development and modification of the
30 Pierce County Countywide Planning Policies; and
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32 **Whereas**, the Pierce County Countywide Planning Policies are written policy
33 statements which are to be used solely for establishing a countywide framework from
34 which the County and municipal comprehensive plans are developed and adopted; and
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36 **Whereas**, the framework is intended to ensure that the County and municipal
37 comprehensive plans are consistent; and
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39 **Whereas**, the County adopted its initial Countywide Planning Policies on
40 June 30, 1992; and
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42 **Whereas**, the GMA requires the adoption of multi-county planning policies for the
43 Puget Sound Region; and
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1 **Whereas**, the Puget Sound Regional Council (PSRC) membership is comprised
2 of central Puget Sound counties (King, Pierce, Snohomish and Kitsap), cities and
3 towns, ports, tribes, and transit agencies; and
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5 **Whereas**, the PSRC is the regional authority to adopt multi-county planning
6 policies; and
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8 **Whereas**, the PSRC adopted VISION 2040 at its May 2008 General Assembly
9 meeting; and
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11 **Whereas**, VISION 2040 is the central Puget Sound region's multi-county
12 planning policies; and
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14 **Whereas**, the Pierce County Countywide Planning Policies are required to be
15 consistent with VISION 2040; and
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17 **Whereas**, the Pierce County Growth Management Coordinating Committee
18 (GMCC) is a technical subcommittee to the Pierce County Regional Council (PCRC),
19 and the GMCC includes staff representatives from the County and the cities and towns
20 within Pierce County; and
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22 **Whereas**, the GMCC met in 2009, 2010, and 2011 to develop and refine policy
23 language to reach consistency between the Pierce County Countywide Planning
24 Policies and VISION 2040; and
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26 **Whereas**, the GMCC completed its package of recommendations reflected in the
27 proposed amendment language to the PCRC at its March 24, 2011 meeting; and
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29 **Whereas**, the PCRC discussed the proposed amendment language over several
30 meetings; and
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32 **Whereas**, the PCRC, based upon the recommendation from the GMCC and its
33 own discussions, recommended approval of the proposal at its April 21, 2011 meeting;
34 and
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36 **Whereas**, amendments to the Pierce County Countywide Planning Policies must
37 be adopted through amendment of the original interlocal agreement or by a new
38 interlocal agreement ratified by 60 percent of member jurisdictions in Pierce County
39 representing 75 percent of the total population; and
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41 **Whereas**, an Interlocal Agreement entitled "Amendments to the Pierce County
42 Countywide Planning Policies" has been developed for this purpose, and is included as
43 Exhibit B to this Ordinance; and
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1 **Whereas**, the Pierce County Planning Commission, at its May 24, 2011, regular
2 public hearing, reviewed the proposed amendments to the Pierce County Countywide
3 Planning Policies and recommended approval; and
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5 **Whereas**, an environmental review of the proposed amendments to the Pierce
6 County Countywide Planning Policies was conducted pursuant to Chapter 43.21C RCW
7 and a Determination of Nonsignificance was issued on September 29, 2010; and
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9 **Whereas**, after a properly noticed public hearing, the Community Development
10 Committee of the County Council considered oral and written testimony and forwarded
11 its recommendation to the full Council; and
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13 **Whereas**, the County Council held a public hearing on July 19, 2011, where oral
14 and written testimony was considered; and
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16 **Whereas**, the County Council finds that it is in the public interest to authorize the
17 Pierce County Executive to execute the interlocal agreement; **Now Therefore**,

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20 **BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of Pierce County:**
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23 Section 1. The Pierce County Council acknowledges its approval of the
24 amendments to the Pierce County Countywide Planning Policies recommended by the
25 Pierce County Regional Council, which are attached as Exhibit A and are incorporated
26 herein by reference.
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28 Section 2. The Pierce County Executive is hereby authorized to execute the
29 Interlocal Agreement, attached as Exhibit B and incorporated herein by reference,
30 thereby ratifying the attached amendments to the Pierce County Countywide Planning
31 Policies, and amending Chapter 19D.240 of the Pierce County Code, as recommended
32 by the Pierce County Regional Council.
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1 Section 3. The Pierce County Council adopts Findings of Fact as shown in
2 attached Exhibit C which is incorporated herein by reference.

INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT

**AMENDMENTS TO THE PIERCE COUNTY
COUNTYWIDE PLANNING POLICIES**

This agreement is entered into by and among the cities and towns of Pierce County and Pierce County. This agreement is made pursuant to the provisions of the Interlocal Cooperation Act of 1967, Chapter 39.34 RCW. This agreement has been authorized by the legislative body of each jurisdiction pursuant to formal action and evidenced by execution of the signature page of this agreement.

BACKGROUND:

- A. The Pierce County Regional Council (PCRC) was created in 1992 by interlocal agreement among the cities and towns of Pierce County and Pierce County. The organization is charged with responsibilities, including: serving as a local link to the Puget Sound Regional Council, promoting intergovernmental cooperation, facilitating compliance with the coordination and consistency requirements of the Growth Management Act (Chapter 36.70A RCW) and the Regional Transportation Planning Organization (Chapter 47.80 RCW), and developing a consensus among jurisdictions regarding the development and modification of the Countywide Planning Policies.
- B. The Pierce County Countywide Planning Policies provide for amendments to be adopted through amendment of the original interlocal agreement or by a new interlocal agreement. The Pierce County Countywide Planning Policies may be amended upon the adoption of amendments by the Pierce County Council and ratification by 60 percent of the jurisdictions in Pierce County representing 75 percent of the total Pierce County population as designated by the State Office of Financial Management at the time of the proposed ratification.
- C. The amendment provides for consistency between VISION 2040, the central Puget Sound region's multi-county planning policies, and the Pierce County Countywide Planning Policies.
- D. The Pierce County Regional Council recommended adoption of the proposed amendment on April 21, 2011.

PURPOSE:

This agreement is entered into by the cities and towns of Pierce County and Pierce County for the purpose of ratifying and approving the attached amendment to the Pierce County Countywide Planning Policies (Attachment).

3 This agreement shall become effective upon execution by 60 percent of the jurisdictions
4 in Pierce County, representing 75 percent of the total Pierce County population as
5 designated by the State Office of Financial Management at the time of the proposed
6 ratification. This agreement will remain in effect until subsequently amended or
7 repealed as provided by the Pierce County Countywide Planning Policies.
